Waste Transfer Station

Guidelines for disposals at waste transfer sites

- ⇒ No hazardous waste— asbestos, bio-medical waste, chemicals etc.
- ⇒ No burning barrels or residues
- ⇒ No dead animals
- ⇒ No motor oil, undrained filters, or cooking oil
- ⇒ No pesticide containers, empty boxes only
- ⇒ No deep freezers, air conditioners or refrigerators or any white goods—must be dropped off in the dry waste area and pay the \$15.00 fee to attendant
- ⇒ No batteries
- ⇒ No asphalt shingles— **MUST BE TAKEN TO YOUNGSTOWN LANDFILL SITE**
- ⇒ No loads of dirt, waste gravel, concrete or rocks, sewage or grain dust
- ⇒ No jugs, containers or barrels with any substance in them
- ⇒ No smoking on site
- ⇒ No loads of wood and demolition materials (concrete and shingles in particular)
- ⇒ Four feet maximum length—small amount only! No pallets or pieces of demolition larger than 4 feet by 2 feet)
- ⇒ No tires—ALL TIRES must be taken to Consort, Oyen, Youngstown or Hanna recycling areas
- ⇒ Silage plastic should be tied in a large knot
- ⇒ Wire fencing—wire that is rolled and tied and no larger than 2 feet in diameter and in quantities not exceeding four rolls may be accepted
- ⇒ Transfer stations are not designed to accept loads from large dump trucks or trailers
- ⇒ All loose blowable material must be bagged before disposal at transfer station or landfill

FEES AT YOUNGSTOWN LANDFILL

- ⇒ Demolition \$30.00/tonne
- ⇒ Industrial waste \$30.00/tonne
- ⇒ Sulfur \$30.00/tonne
- ⇒ Asbestos \$30.00/tonne + 1 hr. minimum capping time
- ⇒ Clean burnable wood—no charge
- ⇒ Household waste—no charge
- ⇒ Any demolition and construction waste loads delivered to any waste transfer stations will be billed to the appropriate company

Our students are back in school for another year. Drivers please be careful when driving near and around the school—watch for children walking to and from school. Remember to not travel 52nd Avenue when the school buses are loading or unloading you must **STOP** and not proceed.



Notice to the voters of the Village of Consort. In order to be allowed to vote in the 2013 general municipal elections on October 21, 2013 electors will need to provide one piece of identification. As in previous elections the voting register will still need to be signed and one piece of identification will also be required. Voter identification that will be accepted are as follows: driver's license, government photo id, personal cheque, bank/credit card statement, government cheque, income or property tax assessment, prescription bottle insert, residential lease or mortgage statement, utility bill, vehicle registration, insurance policy, pension plan benefits statement, correspondence from a school, college or university, statement of government benefits—employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax credit, vehicle insurance certificate.

NEW POLICY ON THE WINTER STORAGE OF PERSONAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

Policy Statement:

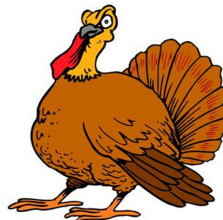
The Village of Consort will provide guidelines to allow for secure winter storage of recreational vehicles.

Policy:

The Village of Consort will provide secure winter storage of privately owned recreational vehicles.

Responsibilities

- The Village CAO will be responsible of the overall operation of the program.
- Privately owned recreational vehicles will be allowed to be stored inside the fenced area on Block 18, plan 8922245 (where the ATCO camp was situated).
- Private individuals who wish to take advantage of this opportunity shall firstly provide the Village office with the registration information of their unit as well as all their personal contact information. "See attached form"
- The Village staff will unlock the gate at the east end off the service road. The recreational vehicles shall be parked along the west fence of this compound; the gate will then be relocked and the key returned to the Village office for security.
- In order to retrieve your RV in the spring contact the Village office to remove your RV removed from the site.
- That a monthly fee of \$25.00 be charged for each recreational vehicle in storage and that this fee be payable upon storage in the fall.
